**Election Day Communion,** Tuesday, November 5 is election day in the United States, and many of us feel very strongly about how or whether Christians should vote during this election cycle. However, our deeper commitment as Christians is to Christ, and we are therefore inviting you to join us for a virtual communion service at 7pm that evening (11/5) in which we will remind ourselves of this by partaking of the body and blood of Christ together. This will be a virtual communion service, which means that you will need to <u>register here</u> to get the Zoom link and bring your own bread and juice (or whatever substitutes you may have). **Pizzas for Peace**. On Sunday, November 10, several of us are going to be reviving an old and much cherished Shalom tradition: the pizzas for peace fundraiser. Shalom members will be making homemade pizzas and serving them for free at church after the Sunday school hour. Although there is no cost to eat pizza, we will be encouraging people to donate the money that they might otherwise have

spent on lunch to Indiana AID. Furthermore, we will be using Everence funds to match the donations, so come and invite others to have some delicious homemade pizza and make a difference in the lives of others.

**Biblical Dialogue on Sexual Orientation**. Several months ago, the Vision & Accountability Team solicited feedback from the congregation on how they would like to proceed on our discernment over sexual orientation and gender identity. Several people expressed a desire to hear people explore Scriptural understandings on these issues and explain what various Biblical passages mean, so we decided to plan a series of Sunday evening services in which those who want to explore this are free to come and prepare for a robust discussion. Pastor Brian has identified two outside speakers who are planning to come and lead the first conversation over the question, "What does God expect Christians who experience same-sex attraction to do with those feelings?" on Sunday, November 17 at 4pm at Shalom. ## FEATURED PERSON OF COLOR BIO

In honor of Hispanic Heritage Month, meet Sophie Cruz.



When she was 5 years old, Sophie Cruz (born 16 October 2009) had as much spunk as a seasoned activist, working for change by reaching one of the most powerful leaders: the Pope.

As the daughter of undocumented immigrants, Cruz notably gave Pope Francis a letter during his 2015 visit to the White House, outlining her fears of deportation and the devaluing of immigrant contributions around the globe.



The little girl hand-delivered the letter -- along with a hug -- to the Pope, writing: "I want to tell you that my heart is very sad, because I'm scared that one day ICE [U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement] is going to deport my parents. I have a right to live with my parents. I have a right to be happy."


Cruz has gone on to be a voice for the children of undocumented immigrants around the globe. Recognized for her great activism, "the following year, [Sophie] was invited to speak at the Washington Women's March. At this point, she was just 6 years old and speaking in front of tens of thousands of people. She began with this touching moment, 'We are here

together, making a chain of love to protect our families. Let us fight with love, faith, and courage so that our families will not be destroyed."

Sophie not only delivered her speech in both English and Spanish, she brought the crowd to tears. She went on to say, "I also want to tell the children not to be afraid because we are not alone. There are still many people that have their hearts filled with love..." She's even taken the migrants' rights message to

the White House and Supreme Court hearings, and has become the face of DAPA to consider protections for parents.

"My friends and I love each other no matter our skin color."



#### **REFLECTION**

Not very long ago I saw something on social media that really grabbed my attention and ever since I saw it, I've found myself thinking about it often. So, I thought I'd share it in this arena. What I saw appeared in the October 14, 1984 issue of *Pentecostal Evangel*. This is not a periodical that I have read before, but this one topic has really made me think, it is titled, "Ten Guidelines for Christian Voters." Each election in my adult life I have felt continually more uncomfortable with the ways politics try to convince followers of Jesus that their responsibility as followers of Jesus is to vote for them. And the ways that some Christians trust politicians to inform them to be faithful instead of what the church has to say about being faithful to God.

Below is the list from *Pentecostal Evangel*. I'd be interested in hearing from any of you what you think about this list. What should be removed and or what should be added? -- Craig

- 1. Do not confuse patriotism, national pride and Western culture with Christian faith and practice.
- 2. Do not confuse secular political activity with the purpose of the church, nor campaigning with witnessing and preaching.
- 3. Do not make slanderous or false accusations against your opponents, but maintain your integrity. Do not consider a brother or sister who is of like precious faith an adversary if he or she holds a different political view.
- 4. At all times endeavor to verify information before accepting it as true or before repeating it to others.
- 5. At all times endeavor to know and understand the candidate's positions and evaluate him or her on that basis, on the basis of his or her ability to perform the duties and functions of the office, and his or her integrity.
- 6. At all times endeavor to know and understand the issues; do not excuse yourself from this duty by saying, "God will show me whom to vote for."

- 7. At all times compare a candidate's position with Scripture but only where the Scripture addresses the issue; do not force Scripture to address issues that the Author did not intend it to address.
- 8. Neither vote nor work for a candidate merely because he or she professes to be of the Christian faith.
- 9. Do not neglect your family, worship, prayer or Bible study.
- 10. At all times uphold your leaders in prayer.
